There are a range of accessible transport options to support the mobility needs of people with physical or sensory disabilities.

#### Huddersfield FreeTownBus

FreeTownBus is a free bus service between key locations around Huddersfield including the bus and rail stations, the university and indoor and outdoor markets.

#### Concessionary travel

A variety of concessionary travel passes are available to blind and disabled people from West Yorkshire Metro. These passes offer free or reduced fare travel.

It is part of the Travel Plan for Lindley Moor Meadows, which aims to encourage residents to travel by sustainable modes of travel that suit their lifestyle.




### The Lindley Moor Meadows Travel Website

## Walking

Walking is a great option for getting where you need to be.

### Why walk?

Walking is a simple and free way to get to work, school or leisure, without the hassle of rush hour or finding a parking space. It reduces the risk of illness, aids weight loss and helps you sleep better.

### Getting around your local area

A variety of amenities are within walking distance of Lindley Moor Meadows including shops, cafes, a library and a pharmacy.

### Walking to school

Moorlands Primary School, Salendine Nook High, Lindley Church of England Infant School, Lindley Junior School and Huddersfield New College are all within a 17-22 minute walk of Lindley Moor Meadows.

## Cycling

Travelling by bike is a fun way to fit exercise into your daily routine.

### Why cycle?

Cycling doubles up as transport to work, the shops, or to school; saving you money, helping the environment, and keeping you fit - all at once!

### Cycling to work or school

Check at your place of work whether there is a cycle to work scheme which can make buying a bike more affordable. Salendine Nook High and Huddersfield New College are both within a 5 minute cycle of Lindley Moor Meadows.

### Cycle routes

There are a number of advisory cycle routes around Lindley Moor Meadows. There are also cycle lanes on either side of New Hey Road providing a connection to Huddersfield City Centre.

## Public Transport

There are practical options for travelling by bus or train if you live at Lindley Moor Meadows.

### Travelling by bus - apply for your free MCard!

Public transport use is good for you and for the environment - a full bus takes 50 cars off the road. The nearest bus stops are on Crosland Road, a 7 minute walk away from Lindley Moor Meadows. ### Travelling by train

Huddersfield rail station can be reached by taking the 370 or 371 from the stop on Cowrakes Road. Alternatively, you can cycle to the station in 15 minutes. The station serves a number of destinations including Leeds, Bradford, Sheffield, Newcastle, Manchester and Liverpool.
